AGM Chairmans address

Welcome to the AGM - hope you enjoyed the food - thanks to the Split Willow team and to Ellie who has put this together. It certainly doesn't feel like a year since we were at the Padarn Lake discussing what 2018 might bring and electing a new committee, a task we will once again be taking on this evening.

On that note I'm delighted that we have a list of nominees for each committee role. Hopefully this will avoid a certain amount of awkwardness later when we elect the committee. However, if anyone would like to join the committee in any of the roles then please feel free to throw your hat in the ring.

I'd like to extend my thanks to the whole committee for their work and support this year. As always the time that is given to club duties can't be underestimated or under appreciated, all while holding full time jobs, dealing with kids and all of the other stuff life throws at us!

We have some members of the committee who will be stepping down this year and so huge thanks to Sioned Rowlands and Becki Law for all their hard work. Sioned has always provided a strong voice in committee meetings and when necessary a strong guiding hand! Becky has done some exceptional work over the last couple of years as Cross Country secretary and she will be sorely missed. Paul Jenkinson will be standing down as Mountain Running secretary, however, will remain as Junior co-ordinator.

Since the last AGM we have a new Treasurer in the shape of Eurwyn Edwards. He responded to a call necessary due to the unbelievable amount of work required just to create a new bank account! A huge amount of work and in particular time was put in by Jenny Heming and then Eurwyn in order to get it all sorted and we are all hugely grateful. I think Eurwyn has taken on the biggest job in the club and I don't think I fully appreciated just what a task it was. The work to get everything in order is ongoing and now we have a clearer picture we fully appreciate the scale of the task.

It has been a quieter year in the sense that we haven't had the big events of 2017 but a huge amount has still gone on.

There have been representations from the club at a number of team events this year including the Lee Mill Valley Relays, Castles Relay and more recently Trofeo Vanoni in Morbegno, Italy. And of course the cross country and Borders league races. We said last year that Snowdon would be a

qualifying race for Trofeo Vanoni and it worked really well with 3 men and 2 ladies going to Italy. Some more lessons were learnt and in 2019 we will make all our own arrangements as early as possible.

In an effort to not rain on the secretaries reports I'm going to say no more!!

What I'd like to do is talk about some of the people who make the club tick and to give an idea of what they do. They are in no particular order!

Dyfed Whiteside-Thomas aka The Boss. We all know that Thursday Night Hills has been a success for some time. However, it continues to grow with a shorter version added to the traditional route and recently over 40 runners attended. A significant amount of work that reaps rich rewards. Finally, he's the clubs male welfare officer!

Becki Law has been the Cross Country secretary for the last couple of years and has done a fantastic job! Organising, cajoling, corralling runners out on a Saturday in all weathers (remember Llandudno last year!!) to make sure there were Eryri teams takes enthusiasm, commitment and perseverance which Becki has in spades. Until this year Eryri have always organised a round at Treborth and Becki has organised that too. This brings its own challenges as the officials of the league need satisfying with course route and marking along with appropriate facilities, tea and cake! Oh and Becki often bakes cakes for those travelling to fixtures! Becki's enthusiasm has been the cornerstone of our recent cross country success and hopefully that will be passed on to the new secretary (actually secretaries but more on that later). As I said earlier Becki is stepping down this year and so on behalf of the club and committee thank you for all your work.

Arwel Lewis is a long standing member of the committee and Road Running Secretary. I'm not sure Arwel ever has a weekend off. Whether its organising races like the Caernarfon 10k, traveling far and wide to run in a variety of races or gathering runners for the Borders League Arwel's life is about running! Oh and just the matter of an important job at the Uni and involvement with Welsh Athletics. Again huge amounts of work that

sometimes is extremely frustrating! In particular the Borders League and gathering teams. The committee is committed to continue to support these events and hopefully the popularity of these events will grow from the hardcore that currently go to each event. Thanks Arwel your role needs someone committed and who will keep pushing and hopefully it will pay off.

I spent a lot of last year talking about Mike Blake so I'm going to keep this brief! We know just how much he does and although he unfortunately didn't win the overall prize at Sports Personality he had a great time as did this of us who went to the show.

Lou Beetlestone is an "ordinary member" of the committee and in this role has taken to organising Sunday Morning Runs and gathering runners for the British Champs races which has proved incredibly successful with the ladies finishing 2nd in the last two years. A great job and one that hopefully will continue.

Although everyone on the committee is valuable and some who aren't on the committee contribute hugely there are a couple more people I'd like to mention:

Ellie Salisbury - social secretary, Gladstone 9 organiser, serial runner taking the Eryri vest across north and south wales

Dilwyn Rowlands, Jenny Williamson and Paul Jenkinson who all lead training sessions. Jenny in Llanberis on a Monday night, Dilwyn from Y Felinheli on a Tuesday night and Paul organising Junior training on a Sunday morning. The sessions are well attended, they are another opportunity to inspire the next generation and to encourage people not only to run but to go on and become members of the club.

A donation was made on behalf of the club and the committee have also agreed to name the most improved male runner award in his honour. On Sunday 13th January a social run will be organised to give people an opportunity to come together and remember Rory. It will likely be from Llanberis over some of Rory's favourite ground and a collection will be organised for a donation in his name. These things have been put in place with the agreement of Rory's family and I'd like to thank Dyfed and Rhian who have discussed everything with Kelly and her family. An incredibly sad loss to all.

AGM ROAD RUNNING REPORT 2018

TUESDAY 20th NOVEMBER – SPLIT WILLOW. LLANFAIRFECHAN

Last Sunday, 18th November saw almost 3,000 runners competing in the Conwy Half Marathon, a record turnout for the event, the previous week, in the Borders Road Running League 5 mile race at Upton, near Chester, there was a league record 441 finishers and it follows a current trend, particularly in road with increased participation in road races around the UK. Most events race entries are via on-line and their events fill up very quickly and there are more events than ever to cater for the increased demand. This poses another issue, a congested race calendar! Long standing events who have fixed dates for their races going back numerous years, find that their, "fixed race day" is also being used as the date for other "new" events in their region. While competition is very good, surely a degree of decorum should be adhered to! UKAthletics have now done away with Regional Race Licence Officers who would have been able to arrange fixtures so that they would not clash with other regional events but, all road race licences are obtained through the "Run Britain" website and it is a free for all!

The bad news first. Our participation in the Borders Road Running League is coming under threat, especially from clubs who have been denied entry into the League because of the increased numbers participating, the league decided not to allow any more clubs entry in to the league otherwise, it could have led to a race limit coming into force for some of the events. If it was not for our women, we may well have been booted out by now for not supporting the league with club members not turning out in sufficient numbers to validate our membership of the league! Only the two men ran at Upton recently following on from the four that ran in the first event of the 2018/19 season at New Brighton. After two of seven events, Eryri's men are currently holding up the whole league! Use it or lose it, as the saying goes.

The good news: At least our women are showing an interest in the BRRL, following on from winning the Improvers Trophy last season, they have made a solid start to date, currently occupying 4th position in Division 2. All Border League races are free to enter. (The club pay an affiliation fee of £50) 7 Races, all free, just turn up in your club vests and run. To date, Eryri have competed in 137 Borders Road Running League Races.

THE BORDERS ROAD RUNNING LEAGUE – HISTORY/INFORMATION

The Borders Road Running League was formed in 1983 by a number of new running clubs in North Wales and the western part of Cheshire. The aim was to provide inter-club competition between teams of member clubs on a competitive yet friendly basis. This philosophy continues today each winter with 7 races organised in rotation by member clubs for their members.

The first Borders League race was held on Sunday 4th November 1984 at Tattenhall using the quarter marathon course. There were 100 finishers. The last two or three seasons have witnessed an explosion in participation levels, with the average number of finishers reaching 350 last season, and an all-time record of 430 being set up at one race in 2017-18.

In season 2018-19, the League comprises 17 clubs from across North Wales, Wirral and west Cheshire. The League remains primarily an inter-club competition, although there are awards for individuals within their age groups.

Clubs interested in joining should, in the first instance, contact the Secretary at bordersleague2014@gmail.com It should, however, be borne in mind that the increasing participation levels (referred to above) amongst existing member clubs are causing capacity issues at a number of venues. Irrespective of this, formal applications will be discussed at the AGM.

The League races are an opportunity for runners at all levels to compete on a regular basis, a chance to test yourself against runners from other clubs at a similar level, improving performance in an affordable but challenging arena, creating and maintaining friendships between like-minded individuals.

The League holds seven races per season, generally between October and April. Each race is between 5 miles and 6.21 miles (8 to 10 km) except for the final race which is around 4 miles (6.5km). Races, except the final race, on Sunday mornings, almost invariably with a start time of 11.00. Dates and venues are agreed at the AGM. Each race is organised by a member club, all member clubs organising races in turn (agreed at the AGM). The final race is generally on a Wednesday evening and is followed by the presentation of awards.

At the end of each race the scores are collected by individual clubs and returned to the Results Secretary to be collated. They are published on the Borders League website.

The League is managed by the member clubs. A committee consisting of a Chairman, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Secretary and Results Secretary is elected by the clubs annually at the AGM – generally held on the first Monday in July of every year. Each club pays an annual subscription to the league, the amount being set at the AGM.

There have been notable successes on the road for Eryri, Bronwen Jenkinson won the Welsh 10k title at the Nick Beer event on 11th February, Bronwen also improved on her 10k PB time with 36.07 at Leeds recently. Rob Samuel also ran at Leeds, clocking 30.26, just 5 seconds off his PB for the distance. The clubs road running championships again failed to inspire, with ten races to choose from, with the best five results to count, only three of our club members are eligible for awards having completed at least five races. Another rethink required for next year? Despite a very good turnout by Eryri members at several road races around the area: 30 at the Felinheli 10k and 25 at the Anglesey H/M etc.

The Caernarfon 10k has hosted the North Wales Regional Championships since 2005 and the Welsh 10k Championships in 2008 and 2012 that has been taken away from us next year, with the possible option of moving the event to a midweek date? TBC.

London Marathon Club Entries: The club have been awarded two entries for 2019. To be in with a chance of receiving one of these, club members must be first claim members and must print out their (Ballot) Virgin London Marathon rejection email (Dated) and be at the clubs Christmas Fun Run in Llanberis on Sunday 16th December where, a ballot will take place.

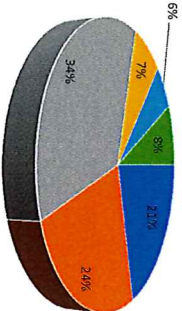

Distribution by Location

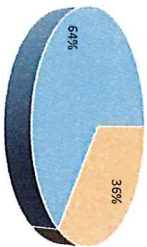

Club distribution by Location

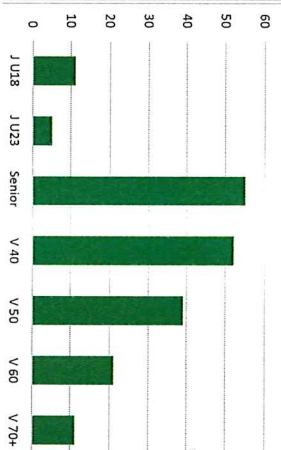

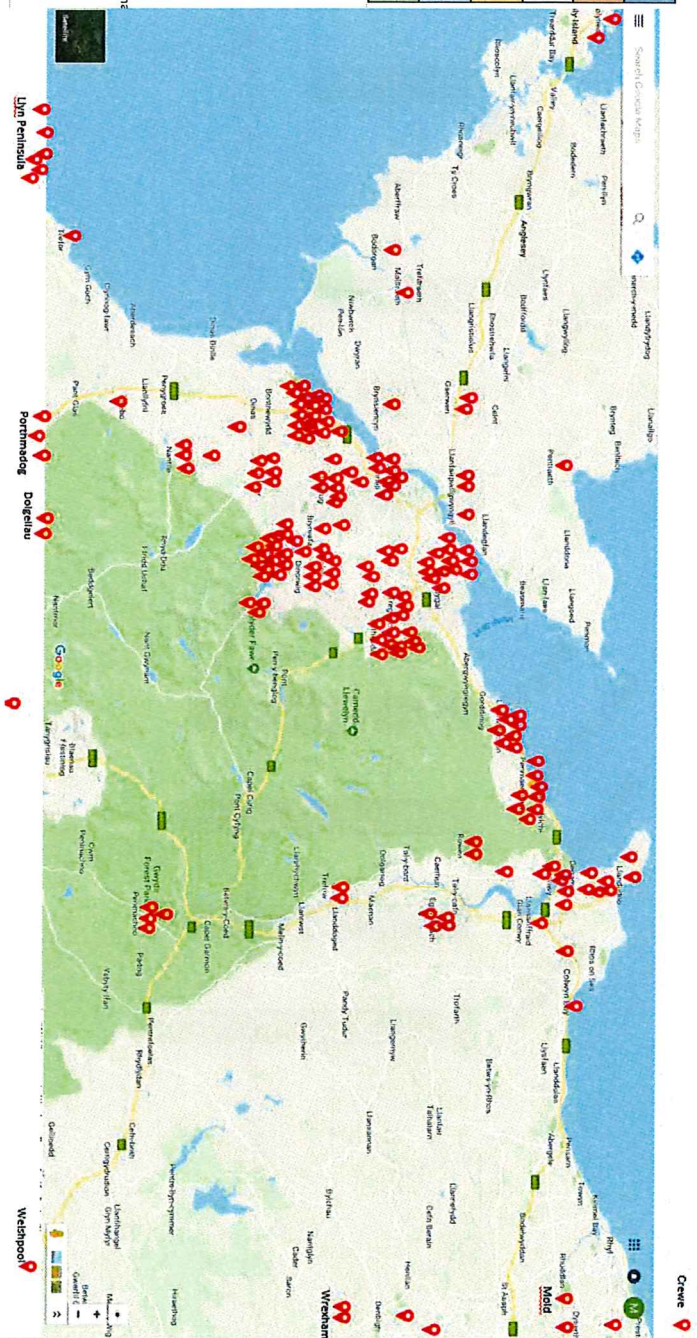
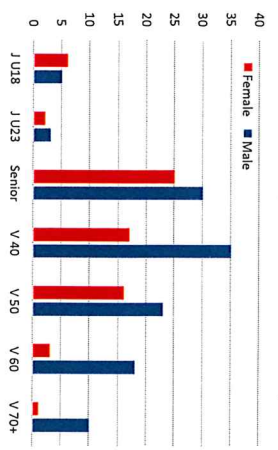
Male vs Female Distribution



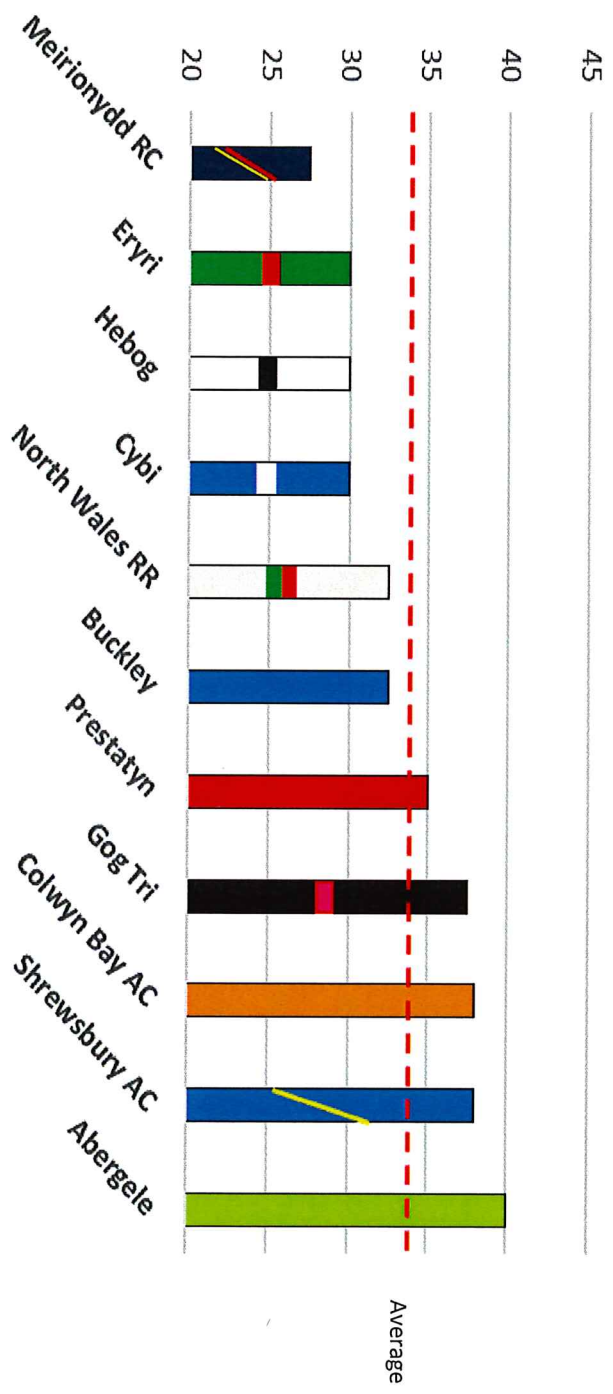
Age Distribution (M, All Members)



Age distribution (M, Males and Females)











